Happy New Year! December is always a hectic month for USATF LDR, with the Annual Meeting and USATF Club Cross Country Championships as well as the USATF Marathon Championships for 2022.

The LDR community enjoyed gathering in Orlando for the first fully in-person USATF Annual Meeting since December of 2019 for productive meetings about the future of our sport.

Paige Stoner (2:26:02) and Futsum Zeinasellassie (2:11:01) won the titles at the USATF Marathon Championships hosted by California International Marathon. Thirty-five men and thirty-four women qualified for the Olympic Marathon Trials, while an additional five men and nine women improved their qualifying marks for the Trials.

Cole Hocker and Bethany Hasz won the titles at the USATF Club Cross Country Championships contested on a ¾-mile loop course that was quickly devised after the City of San Francisco closed Golden Gate Park following a huge tree falling near the start line of the traditional course.

Meriah Earle (Masters Women), Nat Larsen (Masters Men's 60+), and Sergio Reyes (Masters Men's 40+) were the fastest of the day in the Masters championships, while Joannie Siegler (Masters Women), Jacob Nur (Masters Men's 60+), and Peter Hammer (Masters Men's 40+) were the top age-graded finishers.

Richmond hosts the USA Cross Country Championships on January 21, which serves as the selection races for the World Athletics Cross Country Championships hosted by Australia in February. It was the morning of Sunday, December 4th, and the closing session of the USATF Annual Meeting was a wrap. Most attendees were on their way to MCO to catch their flight. I spent the time watching the live results come rolling in from the California International Marathon which was hosting our last USARC event for 2022 – the National Marathon Road Championships. The clock, specifically 2:37:00, was my focus...how many would get in under that mark?

You may or may not know that CIM is hosted by the Sacramento Running Association whose tagline is "Inspiring Achievement Step by Step."
The Sacramento Running Association (SRA) is a community-based non-profit that promotes the sport of running in the greater Sacramento area. The SRA spends over \$1 million annually to manage events and programs to benefit local runners of all ages and abilities, but on this day, they were welcoming runners from throughout the United States.

Women's LDR liaison and National Championships Chair, Darren DeReuck, texted me, "It is a perfect morning for racing." I couldn't stop smiling as the expected rain had stayed away.

Paige Stoner (in her 3rd ever marathon) and Lauren Hurley (in her marathon debut) broke away from the field past the 10-kilometer mark. Stoner edged past Hurley at 30 kilometers and pulled away over the final stretches of the race

Stoner, a graduate of Syracuse University, shattered the women's course record by 51 seconds – winning in a time of 2 hours, 26 minutes, and 2 seconds. This result puts her in the 10th position on the current list of Women's OT Qualifiers for our 2024 Olympic Team Trials – Women's Marathon which is set for Saturday, February 3, 2024, in Orlando Florida.

Hurley finished in second place in a time of 2:27:41, and Elaina Tabb took third in 2:28:04.

This change turned out to be very important to two women at this race. Caroline Williams ran a gun time of 2:37:01 but a chip time of 2:36:57 ---she qualified via chip time Polina Hodnette ran a gun time of 2:37:02 but a chip time of 2:36:54--- she qualified via chip time

More good news! There were 9 finishers at CIM who improved their previous OTQ marks.

The qualification system for athletics competition at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, to be held August 2-11, 2024, has been published.

There will be a dual pathway of qualification, with 50% of athletes qualifying through entry standards and the remaining 50% qualifying through World Rankings. The entry standard for the women's marathon is 2:26:50. The athletics program will include a total of 1810 athletes (905 woman/ 905 men) and will be composed of 23 women's events and 23 men's events as well as two mixed events – the 4x400m mixed relay and the 35km mixed team race walk.

For the 10,000m, combined events, race walks and relays, the qualification period runs from 31 December 31, 2022, to June 30, 2024. For the marathon, the qualification window is from 1 November 1, 2022, to April 30, 2024. For all other events, the qualification period runs from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024.

For the marathon, any athlete ranked higher than the 65th athlete on the filtered Quota Place "Road to Paris" list on January 30, 2024, will be considered qualified. After January 30, 2024, the remaining 20% of the quota will be determined by the same dual pathway qualification criteria outlined above, without displacing the athletes qualified per January 30, 2024. Any national Olympic committee may choose to reallocate a quota place to an unqualified athlete, provided the athlete in the qualification window has achieved at least a 2:11:30 (men) or 2:29:30 (women) performance.

The window for women attempting to qualify for our OTM via the half marathon (1:12:00) opens on January 1, 2023. I am very optimistic that we will see more athletes added to the list of qualifiers before this month is over. I wish you all a Healthy and Happy New Year!

MASTERS RACES AT THE 2022 CLUB CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS San Francisco, CA. Dec 10, 2022. These races will be bragged about for a long time. The wind howled, the rain came down in buckets, a full-size tree was toppled, almost wiping out one of the Club tents in the starting area. The Women's 6 km Race at 10 AM went off as scheduled as did the Men's 60+8 Km race at 10:45 Am. Toward the end of the M60+ race, the tree toppled as winds gusted to over 40 mph, and the City of San Francisco wanted to close Golden Gate Park to protect lives. USATF negotiated a 45-minute delay and a change of venue. Rather than run the races over the planned Cross Country course, the Men's 40+ 10 Km Race, the Open Women's 10 Km race and the Open Men's 10 Km races would be run on the 1200 meter oval Track inside the Polo Field Stadium. No trees would fall on the competitors then! The races were 7.75 laps or about 9.3 Km.

Additional 2023 USATF Championship Race bid accepted

Aravaipa Running, and event company based in Phoenix, Arizona, has recently purchased the Jackpot Ultra and have put in a bid to host the USATF 100 Mile National Championship, March 3rd. Jamil Coury, owner and CEO of Aravaipa has been informed of the requirements of course measuring and certification, pre-race verification, and the preference for having a level A measurer on site during the race. This process will hopefully avoid any of the mishaps that occurred with the inadvertently short course in 2022. The council approved the bid for 2023 and 2024 pending course certification and approval from the National Office.

major limb from one of the giant sequoia's broke off and fell near to the start line. Because of this, Golden Gate parked was closed due to the dangerous conditions. Fortunately, the LOC, USATF and officials were able to work out a solution with the park to continue the competition on the racetrack surrounding the polo field. While far from being a perfect cross country course, it was a far better alternative than canceling the championships.
